### Course Selection Guide

**State of Michigan Dual Enrollment Rules DO NOT allow Physical Education, Hobby, or Theology courses.**

Any English, Math, Science, Political Science, Psychology, or History (U.S., European, or World) require special approval from the CVS counselor because the State of Michigan Dual Enrollment Rules say you must take the college level courses at your high school first. Since we have Advanced Placement courses in these areas, the college courses at Macomb in these areas DO NOT qualify for Dual Enrollment.
